Expect more messages about this event and feel free to share your own ideas with Emily & Judy. This is going to be lots of fun, and we hope that everyone will come

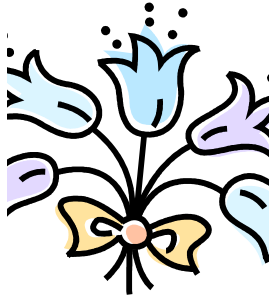

## CROP WALK— Sunday, October 30 CROP MEAL—Thursday, October 27



A recently released statistic states that one in six people in the United States are hungry. On the planet, there are one billion people who will eat only one meal, or less, this day. In the time it takes you to read this article-about 20 seconds- 4 children died from hunger related issues. Truly, hunger is just that serious a problem; and people of good faith often feel powerless.

We are not powerless. We can do something. The annual area CROP Walk and CROP Meal are happening later this month. CROP is an arm of Church World Service and your donations reach the hungry all over the Earth and portion stays right here in Bridgewater.

If you have the power to walk - come walk with us. If you have the power to purchase a meal - consider having dinner at Bridgewater College. It may be within your power to make a cash donation - just one dollar can provide up to seven meals. We have the power to make a difference in the fight against hunger.

The CROP Meal takes place at in the dining hall at Bridgewater College on Thursday, October 27<sup>th</sup>, from 4:45 -7:00 p.m. Students donate their supper and the funds from each meal “sold” to folks from the community goes directly to CROP. Last year, over 300 meals were generously sacrificed by students, but only 200 or so were “sold.” Think about taking a friend or someone from the Village to dinner that night. Maybe just gather together with friends here at BPC and have a meal out. I have eaten at the college, and it is good food to be sure!

The CROP Walk begins at 2:00 at the Town Hall on Sunday, October 30<sup>th</sup>. There is a 10K (6.2 mile) route and a 5K (3.1 mile) route. Last year, \$9,609.90 was raised. This year’s goal is to top \$10,000. With the help of Christians throughout this community, it can be done!

BPC is making a return visit to the Volunteer Farm on Sat. Oct. 1st It’s officially harvest season, and our trip should be fun. Come along, spend a morning doing “an honest day’s work!” This local ministry grows food on prime farming acres to do one thing - feed the hungry in the Shenandoah Valley. It does so with the aid of volunteer labor of all ages. The farm contributes to the network of food banks that feed 150,000 monthly. Over the last seven years, the Volunteer Farm has supplied 204 tons of food (408,000 pounds) to two food banks. That is an amazing feat, and it happens because people care and volunteer their time.

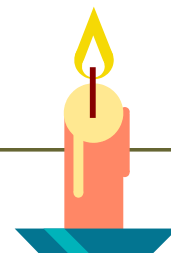

### **A House for a Local Family**

In the Session meeting of September 19, a letter from Summit Church of the Brethren was read. Summit announced it had undertaken a project of providing a home for a long-time neighbor of the church. This couple were not a member, but "just neighbors" of the church. In October of 2010, the church began a campaign to raise funds.

There is an article in *The Daily News-Record* covering this story (Sat. Sep. 24 edition). The essence of the letter and article is that \$27,000 of the \$50,000 goal of building a decent house for those folks has been raised. A church member has provided a no-interest loan. The new home is in place, but sadly, the husband passed

away before the move-in date. His wife, though, knows her husband would have loved the new house, and is extremely grateful for good neighbors. There is a benefit concert scheduled Saturday, Nov. 12<sup>th</sup> at the Weyers Cave Community Center, where music and food is provided, and a free-will offering will be received. **A Report from the Resource Committee: the 2012 Budget and the Stewardship Campaign**

Fall has arrived and with it comes two very important events in the life of the Church, specifically the formulation of the 2012 operating budget and the annual stewardship campaign. Taken together they will define our ability to fulfill our financial obligations and church programs during the coming year.

First, what is the purpose of the operating budget? The operating budget serves as a blueprint of our designated annual expenditures and how they are distributed to meet existing Church needs. To fund the annual operating budget, the Church depends upon those revenues derived primarily from congregational stewardship pledges. It does not incorporate church income that comes from the various dedicated special offerings that occur during the year.

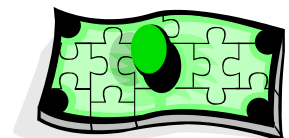
Second, the Resource Committee has taken the following actions pertaining to the 2011 operating budget and the annual Stewardship campaign.

- A preliminary 2012 operating budget was accepted by the Resource Committee and presented to the Session for review and discussion before the Session will approval the final budget. Due to current economic constraints and 2011 revenue shortfalls to date, the proposed 2012 operating budget includes only very minor changes from the 2011 operating budget.
- The Committee sanctioned an August development of a preliminary operating budget and its September presentation to the Session. This is a major change from the past as operating budgets often were not completed until

late December or even January of the following year. Not only will a working operating budget be available to the congregation prior to the annual Stewardship campaign, but the amount needed to fund the operating budget will also be known. The result should be greater clarity in the annual Stewardship campaign.

Space in this newsletter does not permit publication of our preliminary operation budget. A copy will be posted on the kiosk. You can also receive a copy via email by contacting Sally in the church office.

## A Note from the Pastor

I used to watch a TV show called “Hill Street Blues.” It was a cop show with a standard, recurring scene of a briefing room, a gruff, street wise sergeant and patrol officers being briefed before hitting the streets. Sgt. Esterhouse would always send the officers out on patrol with this “benediction: ‘Hey, let’s be careful out there.’”

It is important to note that Sgt. Esterhouse sent the officers out. He knew the perils and dangers of the streets of the city, having served there. He once was wounded in the line of duty, and had several ex-cons who, once they got out of jail, had vengeance on their minds. But send these officers out he did.

Of course, this is just a TV show. Sometimes good fiction can remind us of real life, and teach us lessons about ourselves. This scene reminds us that life can be harsh, that it can be rough on those who wish to do good, or at least not to do any harm. “Seen” as well as “unseen” perils can move people to disengage with the world for many good reasons. Sometimes it just isn’t enough “to be careful out there.”

In Mark 6: 6-12 and in Luke 10: 1-24 we find Jesus sending out disciples, and with His version of “be careful out there.” Again, the point is *to be out there*. Jesus sent the disciples filled with the Holy Spirit, and actually very little else. They were to

“live off of the land,” to “count on the charity of strangers” for support. I go through a checklist of things to have just to go to the store! To go out on a longer trip takes lots of planning and packing (just ask my wife!). I am not sure I could have traveled like the disciples. I think we all prepare for trips and work in our own ways. Sometimes it seems our planning and packing can get in the way of actually taking the journey. Especially when we are dealing with matters of our faith.

We may be hesitant to give some change to that person asking for quarters at the mall; we may not support some ministries because we know of individuals who took advantage of that ministry; we may not want to give up a week’s vacation at the beach for a week of rebuilding houses torn apart by storms; we may fear that if we give away things we may need them later, and won’t have them. We may have been burned in the past, and it truly hurt us to the core.

Try to imagine the conversation between God and Jesus when God sent Jesus into the world protected only by an earthly body, one that was every bit as brittle as ours. Imagine being asked to give up “all being, all knowing, all present, all powerful” for a “hundred and sixty pound container of mostly water and few minerals.” And to be sent

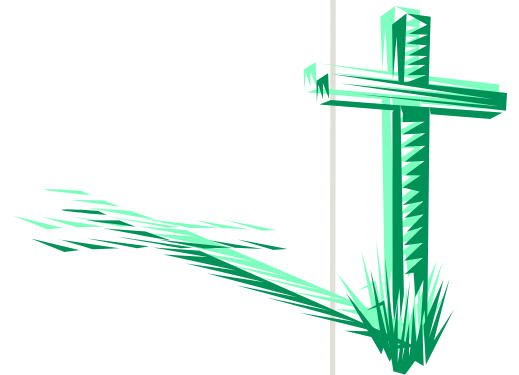
with the words “Be careful out there.” Might make a person stop and take another path.

When we pray out loud these words, “and give us this day our daily bread,” we are asking to be sent out into the world, being cautious of course, but to be out there in body, mind and spirit. If we do not trust God to care for our daily needs, we need not care about the needs of others. However, I propose that if we have a lot of “things,” if we have “the time,” if we have been abundantly blessed, those are God’s words of sending. If we have accepted the abundance of God, if we know God’s presence in our lives and we celebrate it in church, then we are to take it to the world who does not know God as we do.

So, let’s be careful out there, but more importantly, let us be out there.

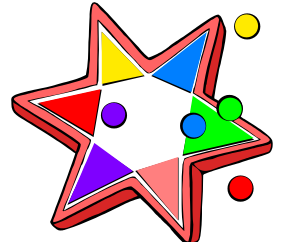
